INSPIRE!

(Turning ideas into actions that make a difference)

On 9 December 2014 the first meeting of the newly formed Inspire! forum was held in St Mary's Church, Borwick. Set up to enable ordinary people, (Christian or otherwise), to have the chance to do something positive about troubling issues of modern day life, the meeting was well attended and chose "Food Poverty" as its first topic. Joyce Tombs facilitated the discussion, making sure that we followed a tried and tested method of learning from each other and creating actions from ideas.

Our vicar, Damian Porter, had volunteered to be the "guinea pig" for this first session, introducing the topic and then taking open questions from everyone. Those attending then contributed their comments, thoughts and ideas based around the questions "How could we be better informed?" and "What practical things can we do to deal with the symptoms and the root causes of food poverty in our nation?" Big questions (!), but nonetheless excellent contributions were made by

all, ranging from better educating people about food use and economics, reducing food waste and predicting shortages, to collecting food in association with other churches.

From the thoughts contributed we decided to focus our actions around improving education and increasing awareness. Agreed actions included writing to the Diocesan Board for Education and others about placing more emphasis on food preparation, etc., in our schools; placing a collection box in St Mary's church for food items (as already in place at St Oswald's) and; organising a cookery event in the Borwick and Priest Hutton Memorial Hall to raise food poverty awareness and collect food donations. Watch this space!

Meanwhile, to be better informed, take a look at the "Feeding Britain" report produced by an All Party Parliamentary Committee and funded by the Archbishop of Canterbury's Charitable Trust. (Well worth a read – just search on-line).

PRIEST HUTTON PARISH MEETING.

Minutes of the meeting held on 15 January 2015.

This is the first AGM for some time and the election of officers was well overdue. Tony Johns proposed to re-elect the present officers and the meeting agreed.

Minutes of the meeting held on 4 September 2014 were read. They were proposed by Tony Johns and seconded by Joan Simcock.

Matters arising - the clerk gave the treasurer a copy of an overdue invoice for work done on the village map. The treasurer said that he would look into the matter. Tony Johns said that recently a delivery man had commented on the map being very helpful in finding the correct properties. Police Report - PC Head reported that burglaries are very high in the area. There had been no reports in the immediate area around Priest Hutton. However there had been quite a few in Carnforth. The main target was electrical equipment that can easily be sold on. The chairman thanked her for coming.

Neighbourhood Watch - Tony Johns reported that a new Neighbour Watch Officer had been appointed. Her name is Louise Birtles and she is sending frequent reports. The meeting agreed that anything appropriate to the Village should be put on Village noticeboard.

B4RN - Keith Brady gave an update on the B4RN project. Digging will restart in March when the weather permits. There are some houses ready for connection and the engineer should be here soon. The meeting wanted a minute made of how grateful they were to everyone concerned in bringing high speed broadband into the Village.

Chairman's Report - The chairman said that he had left a message for Roger Mason regarding the hedges but had had no reply. He also said that the sheep in the Nature Reserve were not belonging to him.

Treasurer's Report - Phil Horsfield presented the accounts and these were accepted by the meeting. He said that our funds were healthy at the moment and maybe members would like to bring to the next meeting some ideas for spending it. The precept of £2000 was agreed and an honorarium of £50 for the clerk. It was agreed that the files etc. that Tony Johns needs for the Village archives should be met by Parish funds.

The Village notice board is kept tidy and relevant by Jean Johns. The clerk thanked her for doing this task on behalf of the Village. Any notices outside of official documents and general all village functions should be kept to a minimum. It was agreed that the noticeboard is primarily for the publication of village business / events plus those of interest taking place in the locality. It is not for the advertising of businesses or the sale of personal items. Traders may, however, leave a business card which will be displayed for 4 weeks and then placed on the shelf at the bottom of the cabinet.

30mph speed restriction - Ruth Castle reported that Lancashire County Council has agreed to extend the 30 mph speed restriction to cover the properties at Hutton View. The local LCC councillor, Susie Charles had been very helpful in this matter.

BORWICK PARISH MEETING

The Borwick Parish Meeting AGM was held in Borwick Hall this month and a number of issues were raised and discussed:

 With regard to the setting up of a First Responders Group in the villages a training meeting will be held on 16 March in the Memorial Hall. There are limited places available on a first come, first served basis. To book your place, please phone David Taylor on (01524) 781715.



- The wind turbine at Catch 23 had been approved by the council but as yet installation work had not commenced although it was noted that the work had to be completed in 3 years.
- Budget cuts were likely to affect the county highways department but it was noted that some of the gullies around the village green needed attention and also that all the road markings on the road near Linden Hall were almost totally erased; the Clerk is also still chasing the county council to mend the sign at Manor Farm crossroads.
- There had also been a number of domestic planning applications only one of which caused concern due to the large area of flat roofing involved. Solar panels may become a issue in the future but planning permission is only needed if the property is a listed building.

The Chairman reported on the excellent job done by Steven Barnes on the Memorial Hall kitchen extension with 2 further grants for this received recently; attendance at the village coffee mornings had also increased; the Houghton Weavers had performed at the hall again raising money for St Mary's Church; and there had been 2 Carol services - one at St Mary's and one given by Tewitfield Methodist Chapel in the hall. As it was the Chairman's last meeting he gave thanks for all the help given and attendance at the meetings over the years and everyone thanked him for all his hard work in the role.

The parish precept was again set at £1000 and it was agreed that this covered all parish needs at the moment. No request had yet been received from the Memorial Hall Committee to help fund further projects.

Election of the committee was as follows: Chairman, Dave Scott; Clerk, Claire Helme and Treasurer, Sue Dowdall as Jane Taylor had now stood down as Treasurer. Mr Colin Taylor was re-elected as Chairman of the Poors Land Charity with the new committee now listed as trustees. The Clerk's honorarium was set at £50 plus possible printing expenses.

The Treasurer gave her report and the accounts were approved and accepted and Jane Taylor

was thanked for all her hard work over the last 2 years. Colin Taylor reported that the Poors Land Charity now had a rental income of £300 and that no money had been paid out to any claimants this year - this was followed by a lively discussion as to the exact location of the parish field. **The B4RN project** is progressing well with many people now connected in both villages. There had been road crossing issues in Priest Hutton where the council had to dig a trench across the road and one under the road near Watson House. Digging stopped in Borwick in November due to waterlogging but will start again as soon as possible and it was hoped that Borwick Court would be completed by midsummer. Dave Scott reported that, in some cases, wired broadband speeds could reach 1000mbs and that it costs £30 per month plus £150 connection fee to be a B4RN customer.

The Clerk gave a brief crime report taken from the police website. There were no crimes



reported in the immediate area in November and December figures were not yet available on the website. Those present commented that the old system of obtaining crime reports was preferable to the less detailed report now available.

Annual litter pick - the date was set for 14 March. The next Parish Meeting will be on 11 May at 7.30pm in Borwick Hall. *Claire Helme (Clerk to Borwick Parish Meeting).*

During his report to the Parish Meeting, Colin Taylor, Chairman of the Trustees for Borwick Village Poor Lands Charity wished to remind all Parishioners that the Charity existed to help them should they need some financial assistance. Colin advised that funds were not large, but a one-off payment could be made quickly should a short-term need arise. Accordingly Colin asked that if any parishioner has, or knows of someone else who could benefit from the Charity, they need only to contact Colin (01524 730084)) where the utmost discretion is assured.
