BORWICK PARISH MEETING

The September Parish Meeting was held at Borwick Hall and a number of issues were discussed over the course of the evening.

A final decision about the wind turbine at Catch 23 was to be made at Lancaster City Council's next planning meeting on 15 September and the council were now recommending approval after changes in the Landscape Officer's latest report. Local MP, David Morris, had been asked to re-assess the situation and the parish are to send a representative to speak against the turbine proposal at the planning meeting.

The Clerk had received a letter from Catch 23 regarding the amount of litter on the verges outside the entrance and they had agreed to monitor the situation closely. Delays regarding the finishing of the landscaped bund and retention of various storage sheds and containers had been approved by the council.

Problems regarding the house in the village abandoned by its tenants with large amounts of rubbish left outside had been resolved and the house was now to be sold. The abandoned car, left by the same tenants, had also been removed from Borwick Hall's car park.

The Treasurer was thanked for her report and it was noted that the accounts had been sent to the external auditor but had not yet been returned.

The local police were unable to attend the meeting and crime reports for the area were in future to be accessed using website details given to the Clerk. Neighbourhood Watch stickers had now been distributed throughout a large part of the village by the local co-ordinators.



The Village Show had again gone extremely well and although the number of entries were down slightly participation by the local children was higher this year. The efforts made by the local police to security tag bicycles for free was also appreciated by all who took up the offer. The Memorial Hall kitchen extension was going well and, although

there had been some unavoidable delays, should be finished by mid-October. The B4RN project was also progressing well with many residents having completed all the infrastructure and just awaiting final connection. The Clerk was asked to write and thank the council for the grass cutting on the village green and it was noted that, due to a recent DEFRA decision, hedges would not now be trimmed until 1 September each year. The County Council had cleaned out the gullies on Borwick Road but had reported finding no problems despite recent complaints of flooding. The next meeting will be the AGM and is scheduled for 12 January 2015 in Borwick Hall.
