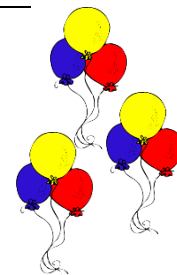

Although we are the ones who will attend to incidents, we are supported by other volunteers from our communities who are active in fundraising and providing the backup needed to get this off the ground and keep it running



In October Jim Thomas and Dorothy Fell ran a successful quiz evening and raffle which raised £370, and Joyce our treasurer and secretary tells us we now have a total of £1054 in the bank.

Although we now have one kit of equipment which includes oxygen, an automatic external defibrillator and other necessary emergency items from the North West Ambulance Service (NWS), our first priority is to get a second kit for the team which will allow us to be quicker and more efficient in our response times. The cost of this is around £1,200. Each Responder also needs to carry a pager which costs around £15 a month, in order to receive alerts from the NWS 999 system.

The group has been thinking of a number of events to continue to raise funds for the team and for the two public access defibrillators that we plan to site near the greens in both Borwick and Priest Hutton.

In association with the Sports and Social Committee we are holding a Ceilidh and Burns Night with haggis and dancing on Saturday 6th February. This promises to be a great evening resurrecting something we did a number of years ago. So if you want to relive those experiences or have arrived in the villages since we last did this, put the date in your diaries for a great family evening to brighten up those winter blues.



We also have further events in the planning stages for later in the year.

We are always looking for volunteers to help us, particularly if you are interested in becoming an actual responder. As a responding team, we are quite small and it would be great to have a few more people trained up. If you are in any way interested, or want to know more please get in touch with me, Heather or Dave for an informal chat.
