#### Update on Ambitious Plans to Revitalise St Mary's Church

St Mary's was built as a "Chapel of Ease" in 1896 to enable villagers from Borwick and Priest Hutton to attend church without having to travel as far as St Oswald's in Warton, which is in fact our Parish Church. However, congregations have diminished over recent years posing a threat to its financial viability and, more importantly, reducing its impact as a hub for the benefit of the local community.

We are very fortunate to have an excellent and well-run village hall which serves our communities well, not least in terms of leisure activities and entertainment. But, if we also want our beautiful church to be here in the heart



of our communities, as an asset for future generations, we need to act now.

So, plans are being made to revitalise St Mary's, central to which is the "reordering" of the church building. Reordering means improving the layout and facilities to make the building more accessible and versatile, whilst retaining its architectural significance and atmosphere of peace and spirituality.

The latest proposal is to build a single storey extension to the west end of church which will become the main entrance to church, offering greatly improved access and housing a disabled toilet with baby-changing facilities. A kitchenette similar to that at St John's, Yealand, tastefully concealed in woodwork to match the historic entrance, is proposed for the rear of the church. Combined with the removal of three rows of rear pews this will enable the provision of basic hospitality for fellowship and meetings.

# A new heating system is planned which, together with draught-proofing measures to the existing entrance, should help preserve the fabric of the building whilst creating a warm and welcoming atmosphere.

Architect's drawings have been produced and we are about to begin the complex consultation and planning approval phase of this project. There is much to do including obtaining tenders, raising funds, instructing contractors, etc. but the most important thing needed is for the community to come together and support the plans. Under the leadership of our new vicar, Reverend Robin Figg, the church community is redefining its mission which includes reaching out to the local community. We hope that for the wider community there will be belief in the importance of securing the future of an architecturally significant and valued building, providing a space that will bring our villages even closer together.

#### BORWICK PARISH

At Borwick Parish Meeting held on 11 October the meeting began with a talk given by Mr Alex Mollart of Clear Water Fisheries. Alex described how he had purchased the land as a bankruptcy and how he intended to run it as an exclusive fishery, and a hobby, at the same time making the effort to protect and encourage



wildlife on the site. Around  $\pounds$ 7k has already been spent on the planting of trees, creation of reed beds and paths around the site including a path around the perimeter which the public can access. There were no plans for caravans but permission for a limited number of log cabins might be applied for in the future. The wind turbine is also off the agenda.

The Chairman reported on the **Emergency Plan** and stated that a plan activation meeting (Exercise Moorgarth) held at Halton had revealed several areas in our plan which needed some refinement but that it had been a useful exercise for all of the community emergency groups involved.

**The Treasurer** stated that the accounts had been audited with no charge and the conclusion placed on the noticeboards along with the annual report and external auditor's certificate. The balance of the current account stands at £684 as £500 has just been paid to the Memorial Hall for new chairs and there was also £1318 in the Skipton Building Society.



With regard to **planning issues** the Chairman reported that the Council were looking into development at Featherbed Meadow where a large wooden structure, almost double the size of the original had appeared, despite conditions being imposed in 2014. With regard to the Villa Site, planning enforcement notices had eventually been served after the Chairman and Clerk met with the Planning Manager back in May. The Clerk stated that around 33 planning

conditions were originally put on the site but by applying for the 'discharging of conditions' many of these restrictions had now been lifted and it was believed that a compromise would be the outcome. It was noted that soil and debris was still being moved from the site without the relevant permission.

**County Councillor Philippa Williamson**, representing our new county council division of Lancaster Rural North, was introduced to the Meeting. After complaints from the Clerk and Chairman about the new reporting system for highways faults she suggested the best route for reporting potholes, gulley issues and flooding problems might be through her and, indeed, she had already reported some issues regarding the road surface which were subsequently patched up. It was agreed the Chairman and Clerk would draw up an extensive list of issues and report to her in due course.

With regard to the **mowing schedule for the village green** the Clerk reported that this had taken place at regular 3-4 week intervals, apart from a gap at the end of August and September, where prolonged rain had caused setbacks but that the last mowing took place on 9 October and that overall the city council had done a good job. The grass has been strimmed between the trees and the drainage is working effectively.

The Clerk reported that the rent for the **Poors Land Charity** has been received, the balance of the account stands at £1927, and that the Chairman needs to be added as a signatory.

The Chairman explained the new proposal to **update the existing website for Priest Hutton and the Memorial Hall** and to add Borwick to the site using links to the Parish Meeting, St Mary's Church etc. This would incur a one off cost of £60 to register the domain name and £16 per annum afterwards and the input of information would be managed by Ken Richardson. All present voted in favour of the proposal.

As you will know we received a grant from the Council to develop an emergency plan and upgrade the

Village Hall to operate as a refuge for villagers in the event of a local emergency - for example flooding or loss of power.

In addition, we submitted a draft plan to the council which sets out how we would activate the use of the hall, communicate with residents and how we would contact them. We said we would use email or personal contact.

Whilst email communication through the newsletter list is possible via Jean, that may not be possible in the event of a power cut and secondly it relies on Jean being available. We recognised that there are issues re data protection around sharing people's personal information and took advice from the council.



As a result we propose to develop a separate list which would be for use in the circumstances outlined above and be available for use by our primary emergency contacts – Eric Rooney, Keith Brady, Claire Helme and Dave Scott. Ideally this would include your email address for warnings and your address and phone number should we want to advise you of the situation and support available if the power goes down.

I appreciate this is a potentially sensitive issue, and understand if you don't want to give us all of your information.

If you do agree to us having this information, please email or contact Jean with the details as she has agreed to compile the list. She will need your consent for us to use your email address, and include your postal address and phone number if you are happy for these to be used also.
