Remembrance Sunday

I do not think we could have wished for a better day on which to consecrate our War Memorial and to fulfil our Act of Remembrance. A calm autumn day with blue skies and bright sunshine provided the perfect backdrop to a memorable community event.

The Reverend Robin Figg, Vicar of St Oswald's, led the Service of Remembrance, first in the Hall, and then at the Memorial itself where wreaths of poppies were laid by the Clerks of our two parishes and by myself on behalf of the Memorial Hall.

Our bugler, cadet instructor Joe Ashton from the Royal Marines in Preston, played the Last Post as a prelude to the two minutes silence. Many villagers remarked to me afterwards how poignant they found those moments of true quiet when the only noise we heard was the rustle of dry leaves slowly falling on a gentle breeze. I think it allowed all of our thoughts to dwell on those lost and on those we have ourselves lost.

I need to say a big and heartfelt thank you to the many villagers who have helped with the War Memorial in your many and varied ways; whether building it, funding it, designing it, creating memorial gardens, baking cakes for the event itself etc. It is a very long list. You each know who you are, and you are all very much appreciated. Thank you.

This is a local charity based at Lancaster University, which is researching the possible causes of dementia and is also in the process of developing and trialling a drug which might possibly halt/slow down the progression of the disease. The other very worthwhile charity is 'Versus Arthritis', the results of a merger in 2018 between 'Arthritis Research UK' and 'Arthritis Care'. Their aim is to try and prevent the devastating impact that arthritis has on people's lives by offering not only help and support to those directly affected with the condition but also to the carers of those suffering from arthritis.

Both of these charities are being supported in memory of two local residents, Tony Sunderland and Jeff Gudgeon, who sadly passed away earlier this year. Further information for each charity is available from the relevant websites.

Our Coffee Mornings are usually held on the last Saturday of the month but in December it will be held on the 14th due to a prior booking of the hall. Billed as a biopic about Bert Trautmann, the former POW who became a folk hero in the Manchester City goal, the film had something of everything; humour, romance and an edge of social realism as it dealt with understandable reactions to the Iron Cross-holding Trautmann by Manchester's Jewish community. As the film moved forward into the 1950s Bert had his own tragedy to bear when he lost his son in a road accident. If that sounds too serious, it really was not so gloomy. It is a very upbeat movie with an optimistic message and something for everyone.

Our next movie, "Mrs Lowry & Son", will be shown on Friday 17 January; doors open at 7.00pm for a 7.30pm start. This movie puts us on familiar ground in Salford and Ancoats, Manchester. Vanessa Redgrave gives a shrewd and amusingly bleak performance here as Elizabeth Lowry, the cantankerous and bedridden mother of the artist LS Lowry played by Timothy Spall, with stellar performances by both. I am told that the film is very much like a close-up theatrical performance and it should be very well suited to our venue.
