Services and church opening during the COVID-19 restrictions

During the next phase of Covid-19 restrictions from 3 December the pattern of services in our benefice is expected to be as follows:

Sunday 9.30am online. A livestream Eucharist broadcast from either St Mary's, Borwick or St John's, Yealand; this service can be viewed on our benefice YouTube channel.

Sunday 11.00am at St Oswald's, Warton. A public Eucharist with a maximum of 50 people able to attend the service; appropriate hygiene and social distancing measures will be in place.

Wednesday 9.30am at St John's, Yealand. A public Eucharist with a maximum of 30 people able to attend the service; appropriate hygiene and social distancing measures will be in place.

Thursday 11.00am at St Mary's, Borwick. A public Eucharist with a maximum of 24 people able to attend the service; appropriate hygiene and social distancing measures will be in place.

- Christmas Day. We will celebrate this special day with a 9.30am livestream service and an 11.00am public service at St Oswald's.


