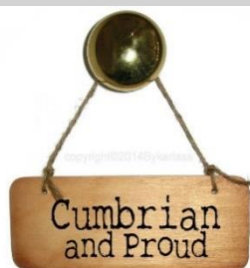
BORWICK & PRIEST HUTTON GARDENERS' CLUB

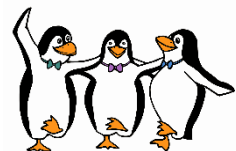

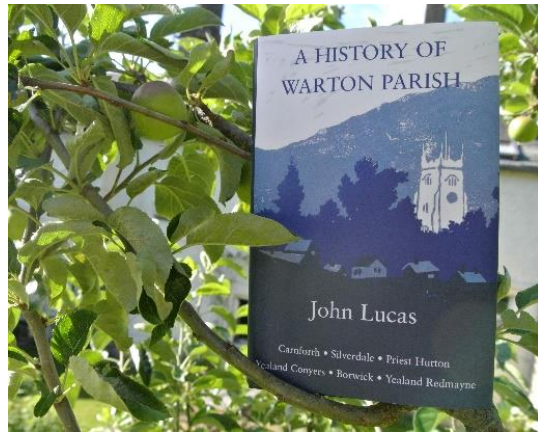

HISTORY TALK:

A New Edition of a Classic Local Book

More than 300 years ago schoolmaster John Lucas sat down to write

‘A History of Warton Parish’

which then – as now – included the townships of **Borwick and Priest Hutton.**

Over the next thirty years he wrote about everything from peat-digging and salt-making to the use of gun-powder in farming...not to mention funerals and harvests, fishing and fairies, meteors, schooldays and football.

The last new edition of the book was published in 1931 by local historian John Rawlinson Ford of Yealand and the retired music critic John Fuller-Maitland, who lived at Borwick Hall until his death in 1936.

Now journalist Andy Denwood has re-edited Lucas's work, adding a new introduction and illustrations by local artist Daphne Lester

Andy will give an illustrated talk about the book and its author at

**Borwick & Priest Hutton Memorial Hall
at 7.30pm on Tuesday October 3rd.**

The book will be on sale after the talk, price £15, along with signed, limited edition copies of some of the illustrations used.
