
Mini Church at Yealand Village Hall

Borwick Parish Meeting

At the Borwick Parish Meeting AGM the formation of a new committee was discussed owing to the earlier resignations of all 3 officers. Dave Smith was elected as Chairman, Dave Scott as Treasurer and Claire Helme later agreed to remain as Clerk for one further year. Sue Dowdall, the outgoing Treasurer, was warmly thanked for all the time and effort she had put into the role for the last 4 years and she wished the new Treasurer well. It was agreed to set the precept at £1000 for this financial year. The bank account balance currently stands at £493 and building Society account at £822 giving a final total of £1,315. With

regard to the Poors Land Charity the balance of account stands at £2,205 with the rent having been collected in July by the Clerk and no requests for financial assistance received to date.

The Marks & Spencer Company Archive enables Marks & Spencer to celebrate and utilise its rich heritage. The collection contains over 71,000 items dating from when the company began in 1884 to the present day. The M & S Archive represents one of Britain's most important corporate archival collections owing to the long history of Marks & Spencer as a key retailer on the British High Street.

Abbey House Museum opened in 1927 and is located in Kirkstall where it is housed in the gatehouse of the ruined Kirkstall Abbey.



Here you can step back in time and wander through streets, shops, houses and experience life as a Victorian. The ground floor of the museum is set out as an area of Victorian Streets illustrating a range of shops and services all with their original fittings. The upstairs galleries feature the History of Kirkstall Abbey, Childhood and Leeds Social History.

Mount Grace Priory Visit

Wednesday 29 May 2019

The principal full-day garden visit of the summer includes an extended stopover in Northallerton, en route for **Mount**



Grace Priory, located at the foot of the Cleveland Hills in North Yorkshire.

Lose yourself in the quiet splendour of this 14th-century gem, considered to be the best-preserved Carthusian priory in England. The Priory, the Arts and Crafts manor house, and the gardens - recently renovated under the direction of Chris Beardshaw - are all available to visit.

Travel is by coach from the Memorial Hall at a cost of £18 per person, and the admission fee is £8.60 on site (2018 price guide;

concessions apply; NT and EH members enter free).

Report of the AGM

The Annual General Meeting of the Gardeners' Club was held at the start of the January meeting. The committee was re-elected and the programme of speakers and visits for the coming year was endorsed.

We are approaching the ruby anniversary and keen to look forward as well as backwards as we celebrate thirty years of good gardening.

HEARTSTART

In conjunction with Burton, Holme and Yealand First Responders we are running a Heartstart course in **Burton Memorial Hall** on **Thursday 16 May from 7.00pm to 9.30pm.**

The course will cover some simple skills which can save lives by helping you to know what to do in a medical emergency until the First Responders or the Ambulance arrive.

The course is open to all age groups and is aimed at those with no recent first aid training. It covers dealing with an unconscious person, learning cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR), and how to deal with a person who is choking, seriously bleeding or may be having a heart attack.
