At the January Parish Meeting concern was expressed that the young people waiting for the school bus on rainy mornings often got soaking wet and consequently would be sitting in wet clothes all day.

Thinking caps went on and, as a temporary measure, it was decided to clean out the telephone box, repair the broken glass, install two bins and 4 golf-size umbrellas, and put up 2 coat hooks.

On rainy days youngsters can now stand under these very large, sturdy umbrellas and when the bus arrives just pop them back into the bins to dry. Any raincoats can also be hung up in there and collected on the way home as can any personal umbrellas.

Positive feedback from parents tells me that this has gone down well!!

## **Borwick Parish**

At the Borwick Parish Meeting held on 16 May, the Chairman reported that there had been an exceptional turnout at the annual village Litter Pick in March with over 15 bags of rubbish collected and he gave thanks to Peter and Sally Sharp for providing refreshments. He stated that he had noticed a spillage of fuel on the canal on 7 April and had reported this to the Environment Agency who quickly cleaned it up.

Open Reach have gone through the village installing new telegraph poles for BT, for high speed broadband provision, but one of the poles had caused a partial collapse of the canal bridge wall near Borwick Bridge and this was subsequently reported to the landowner.

The Clerk reported that she had been investigating the number of signs for various holiday outlets and whether or not they had or needed planning permission, including the large sign in the field south of Borwick Lane which had recently appeared, and is also pursuing highways for repainting of the white lines via Cllr Williamson.

Consultations received including proposed reduced opening hours for the Keer Bridge Recycling Centre and the County Council 'opt-in for local delivery scheme' for maintaining public rights of way.

Complaints were received about cycle races affecting horse riders but it was pointed out that that the Parish Meeting does not routinely receive notification of all of them so cannot inform residents in advance.

Part of the verge near Borwick Hall canal bridge had been missed by the council mowing contractors so it was agreed to point this out to them next time.

The difficulty of access to some of the meeting rooms at Borwick Hall for anyone with disabilities was pointed out by a resident and would be looked at to see if it could be improved, although the Hall is often fully booked.

It was agreed to get the trees on the village green inspected every 2-3 years by experts as the Parish Meeting would be liable if any injuries were caused to third parties by falling branches. With regard to the Poors Land Charity it was agreed to elect the Chairman as a trustee and to alter the building society mandate to add him as a signatory; all existing officers were also re-elected for a further year.

The Treasurer presented the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2019 stating that income was £1000 from the council precept plus interest of £3.92 at the Skipton Building Society; expenditure totalled £945 leaving a net surplus of £58.52. The internal audit had been performed by Phil Horsfield with no issues found and it was explained that the Parish Meeting is exempt from external auditing. The presentation of the Accounts, Accounting Statements, Annual Governance Statement and Annual Risk Assessment were approved by all present at the Meeting. These will be placed on the joint website and are available for inspection should anyone wish to do so. The Treasurer also proposed that the Parish Meeting apply for internet banking to view statements etc. (although cheques will still be written to pay bills) and this was approved by all present. The Parish Meeting Standing Orders which have been reviewed recently will be presented for approval at the AGM in January.

The next meeting was scheduled for 22 October at 7.30pm in Borwick Hall.

## Memorial Hall Committee AGM

The draft minutes from our AGM and May meeting are available at the Memorial Hall.

Margaret Waring, Jean Johns and Dave Scott all stood down from the committee while Dave Smith, the new Borwick Parish Chair, joined us. I know that those stepping down will continue to support us as volunteers but I would like to take this opportunity to thank them all for their great service and support over these years.

This season's highlight, I think, will be the War Memorial which the committee have decided to erect in the south-west corner of the car park. The site has been roughly cleared and we will remove the tree stumps soon. Harry Clarke has kindly donated a limestone gatepost which we will use as the memorial stone itself. We will attach a plaque to the front face bearing the roll of honour. For those who attended the WW1 commemoration evening in 2014 you will recall that Dave Roberts gave a short presentation, "For King and Country", which detailed the lives of the fallen from our two villages. Dave remarked that two casualties, Sydney Warwick and Alfred Gunn, had been omitted from the original roll of honour. Therefore, we will take this chance, on the permanent memorial, to add their names along with that of Sgt Percy Hurst of Priest Hutton, who was lost to WW2.

A good number of villagers are currently busy with this project, preparing the commemorative text, landscaping and designing the memorial garden. Thanks to all of you and I am sure we will have something very worthwhile come November.

\*a brief description of the plot (but no spoilers!) or who/what the book is about


\*what you particularly liked about it

The library van visits the villages at 3-weekly intervals on Wednesday mornings.


