You will no doubt be aware that during the lockdown period our villages, along with many others in the local area, have been donating food and household supplies to support Morecambe Bay Foodbank's work with families in need. Literally tonnes of

items have been generously donated, and the need goes on as more people will inevitably lose their jobs and fall on hard times in the coming months.



Currently, the items being particularly requested by the Foodbank are:

Fruit juice, long-life milk, sugar, instant mash potato, sponge puddings, wrapped biscuits, coffee, pasta sauce, soap and shower gel, loo roll, toothbrushes and toothpaste, feminine hygiene items, and baby milk.

Collection boxes are located at the end of Claire Helme's driveway in Borwick, and Sal Riding's driveway in Priest Hutton. Both boxes are visible from the respective village greens.

I didn't know much about the scope of the Foodbank's work, so did a little research and found a report with some interesting facts about their work in 2019...

Vouchers to exchange for food parcels are distributed by referral agents. In 2019, 75% of vouchers were passed on by Citizens Advice Bureau staff in Morecambe and Lancaster

8,152 emergency 3-day food parcels were given out, with 3,357 of these going to help children

In normal times, people can receive parcels up to 3 times in any given crisis period (usually 6 months) so as not to encourage dependence

60 tonnes of goods were donated by the general public, with a further 24 tonnes of fresh food donated by commercial partners

80 volunteers gave a total of 20,800 volunteer hours – this would cost at least  $\pounds$ 170,000 in wages alone!

## Services and church opening during the COVID-19 restrictions

During the present phase of COVID-19 restrictions the pattern of services in our benefice is as follows:

### 11.00am Saturday at St Oswald's, Warton

A public Eucharist with a maximum of 45 people able to attend the service; appropriate hygiene and social distancing measures will be in place.

#### 10.30am Sunday online

A livestream Eucharist broadcast from either St Mary's, Borwick or St John's, Yealand; this service can be viewed on our benefice YouTube channel.

- St Mary's Sundays 12noon-4.00pm

### Warton Almshouses: subsidised housing for people in need of support

Hundreds of years ago, a Charity was set up by Archbishop Hutton, who came from the Ancient Parish of Warton. The Charity provides subsidised housing for those in need of support and who at the time of applying, live in the parishes of **Warton, Borwick, Priest Hutton, Yealand Conyers, Yealand Redmayne or Silverdale**. At present, there are two vacancies. The properties are available, at significantly lower cost than would be usual, for applicants who can demonstrate a need for such support.

The Alms houses are a pair of semi-detached bungalows, each with a double bedroom and a box room (which could be used as a single bedroom), together with living room, kitchen, bathroom and outdoor area. Viewing can be arranged prior to making an application.

Application forms, and some further details (including costs), are available from the Secretary of Trustees (address below) and must be returned to the Secretary by 4.00pm on 28<sup>th</sup> August. Applications will be considered by the Trustees and short-listed applicants will be called for interview towards the end of September.

### **ART GROUP**


The Art Group will recommence on Fridays, 10am-12 noon, from 11 September, and run during term time.

### Priest Hutton Neighbourhood Watch Report

Lancashire Police recently took part in #KnowExactlyWhere week with emergency services, local authorities and organisations around the UK to raise awareness about the free what3words app - and how it can be used to save precious time, resources and lives in an emergency.

what3words is a location app which has divided the world into a grid of 3m x 3m squares. It has given each square a unique combination of three words - a what3words address. "tortoises.swarm.announce", for example, took rescue workers to a precise location on Ben Nevis where in February 2020 a group of hikers were in trouble. The app is free to download for both iOS and Android and works entirely offline - making it ideal for use in areas of the UK with an unreliable data connection. what3words can also be used via the online map at what3words.com. The technology is available in over 40 languages and can be used anywhere in the world.

#### Recent burglary in Priest Hutton

Some of you may not be aware that there was a recent home burglary in Priest Hutton when the residents were away on holiday. The burglar(s) got into the property by removing the bottom panel of a door, and small items like gold jewellery and cash were stolen. Another similar crime occurred recently in Over Kellett when the owners were away; the thieves got in the same way, with similar types of things taken.

The police think the person/people who did this had been watching people's movements and was aware when the house was empty. If you are going to be leaving your home unoccupied you might want to think about some simple crime prevention measures. We tend to perceive our villages through rosetinted spectacles as we are lucky to live in a low-crime area. The following preventive advice is taken from Lancashire Constabulary's website: \*Close and lock your doors and windows when you go out, even if you are just in the garden.

\*Hide all keys out of sight and away from the letterbox.

\*Fit an intruder alarm in a visible place and test it frequently.

\*Install security lights.

\*Leave a radio or light on a timer.

\*Draw the curtains when you go out at night to make your property look occupied.

\*Remember to cancel deliveries before you go on holiday.

\*Keep an eye on your neighbour's property and encourage them to do the same for you.

\*Keep ladders and tools stored away; don't leave them outside where they could be used to break into your home.

\*Mark your property with your postcode and house number and register your property for free, online, with **Immobilise**.

\*Store any high value items (e.g. jewellery, passports) in a secure place or safe.
