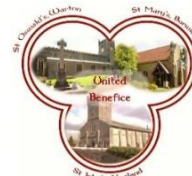

PH Flag Report (Priest Hutton Flood Action Group)

Review of progress to date:

1. Jacob's survey of flood risks and recommendations
2. Uncovering of 5 buried grids on Upp Hall Lane and Whitebeck Lane
3. Upgrading of the grids on Upp Hall Lane from Hutton View to the village green
4. A complete CCTV survey of the culvert – no problems

We are not aware of any other significant areas of concern (perhaps Back Lane?); we are therefore mothballing PH Flag. It can be re-activated if or when there is another flooding incident. In the meantime Kath Moffatt will be monitoring and responding to all flooding

communications from City and County officers.

If anyone has any flooding concerns please contact me as Chair of PH Flag or Nigel Adams as Chair of PH Parish Meeting.

Our thanks are extended to everyone who have supported PH Flag through these past few years, but especially Kath Moffatt for her courtesy, efficiency and tenacity in dealing with Lancashire County and Lancaster City officers. We are also indebted to our County Councillor, Philippa Williamson, for her continuous support.
