

Memorial Hall News



The re-roofing project is now complete and passed pretty much without a hitch. The contractors originally promised to complete the roof in 8 weeks but, owing to the excellent weather, they finished in a little over 5 weeks. Along the way we have managed to incorporate a few improvements over the previous roof. The new one has 4" insulation boards underneath the steel and the drainage and guttering are designed to be resistant to leaf blockage. The eagle eyed will also spot that we have replaced the leaky old Velux window with a flush fitting skylight.



The final cost of the project was £58,320 against an original estimate of £57,165. Not at all bad considering the enormous hike in material costs over the lifetime of the project.

I am really delighted to see that the hall bookings are picking up once again after our reopening and all of our regulars will be back for the autumn season.

Our trees in the main plantation are doing well and we have not needed to water them this year. You will see that they are now all fitted with more substantial tree guards, which will protect them from hungry rabbits and, hopefully, curious sheep.

We decided that our plan to turn the whole field into a wildflower meadow 'in one' was overly ambitious. There is simply too much grass to cut and remove. Instead we will concentrate our efforts on the south-west corner, which is roughly a third of our site. If we can establish the meadow in that area then it will spread naturally to the rest of the field over time.

We will replace the gateposts which have rotted and install sheep-proof fencing at the end of August after which we can allow the bulk of the field to be grazed once again.

If you wander down there you will see that Eddie and Linda have now strimmed the site and removed all of the grass cuttings, so you can see the area of the meadow that we have in mind.





We are up to 6 volunteers now and if anyone is keen and has a few hours to spare please get hold of me. Next jobs are some levelling work on the meadow itself to get rid of the larger stones and, most especially, to make a start on the hedge laying once autumn arrives.
