Mourholme Local History Society www.mourholme.co.uk



Mourholme is the name of the castle that used to stand in the old parish of Warton. It was the home of the mediaeval lords of Warton, and its ruins lie beneath the Borwick end of the Pine Lake resort. Until the nineteenth century Warton parish contained the townships of Borwick, Carnforth, Priest Hutton, Silverdale, Warton, Yealand Redmayne and Yealand Convers. The history group concerns these seven villages. We look at all aspects of local history agricultural, manorial, social, industrial as well as examine of some of its prominent families. Thursday 15 December 2022 Arnside Maritime Heritage – Alasdair Simpson

The Kent estuary forms Kendal's port, and Arnside has a long maritime heritage. There the Victorians held regattas, and it was where Crossfields built Morecambe Bay prawners and other boats from the 1840s to 1940s. Their boats notably included Arthur Ransome's "Swallow" and Arnside Sailing Club's very own "Severn".

Wednesday 25 January 2023 Roman Roads and the Old Roads through Carnforth – Brian Jones

Largely for reasons of geography, the road routes northwards from Lancaster pass through Bolton-le-Sands and Carnforth. Although the changes in the style of transport, and the ages of Canal and Railways, led to modifications to the road network, clear traces of the old routes have been left behind.
