You may know that Revd Robin Figg, our vicar for the past 5 years, has taken early retirement with effect from 31 March 2023. The process of recruiting his replacement is beginning, but a new vicar is unlikely to be in post before 2024.

During the vacancy, life at St Mary's will go on, not least due to the efforts of our licensed lay minister, Annette Mackenzie. A number of retired clergy have also generously agreed to lead regular worship at St Mary's, as have the Area Dean of Tunstall, Canon Cindy Rigney, the Archdeacon of Lancaster, the Venerable David Picken, and the Bishop of Blackburn designate, the Rt Rev Philip North.



Whitebeck Nature Reserve

I checked with the Sakura expert who tells me that cherry trees come into blossom earlier as they age so our young trees will be a little later than the more mature specimens around the village. They are also fairly exposed to the weather and were hit hard by the cold snap at the end of February. All of them are in bud, however, so we should have a decent display by mid-April.

If you have been wondering what the Last of the Summer Wine lookalikes have been doing, armed to the teeth with billhooks and axes every Monday morning, the answer is laying the hedge down at the reserve.

Thanks to an afternoon's tuition, kindly and expertly delivered by Harry Clarke, we managed at least not to kill any of the hawthorn and it is now showing green all along its 70m length. In keeping with local traditions we laid the hedge using the Lancashire and Westmorland method. For further details, please approach any of the team and we can give you chapter and verse on the methodology and materials involved. Our wives all report that this works very well as a sleep-aid.

The wildflower section laid by Linda and Eddie in the autumn is steadily coming to life with plenty of evidence that the seeds and plugs are beginning to sprout. It should provide lots of interest this year and steadily turn into something very special in the years to come.
