You may know that Revd Robin Figg, our vicar for the past 5 years, has taken early retirement with effect from 31 March 2023. The process of recruiting his replacement is beginning, but a new vicar is unlikely to be in post before 2024.

During the vacancy, life at St Mary's will go on, not least due to the efforts of our licensed lay minister, Annette Mackenzie. A number of retired clergy have also generously agreed to lead regular worship at St Mary's, as have the Area Dean of Tunstall, Canon Cindy Rigney, the Archdeacon of Lancaster, the Venerable David Picken, and the Bishop of Blackburn designate, the Rt Rev Philip North.

The event was funded by a grant from the Coronation Fund.





With so much in the news at the moment about the future of farming and nature recovery, we wondered if there would be interest in the village to hear about these plans. We have scheduled a talk in the village hall at 6.30pm on 24th October. Jim will be joined by the Harrison family who are farming the land along with Ruth Dalton.

Ruth spent a decade working for the Rare Breeds Survival Trust, and now advises farmers, land managers and breed societies throughout the UK on sustainable farming. They will provide a bit of history on the farm and set out what they are hoping the new scheme will achieve.

Tuesday 13 June 2023, 7.30pm The Royal Albert Hospital, Lancaster Speaker - Elizabeth Roberts

The hospital was opened in 1870 and established under the Lunacy Act of 1845 as an institution for the care and education of children with learning problems, then adults were admitted from 1913. The building has a very interesting history and was designed by local Lancaster architects Paley & Austin.

I am sure we will learn more during this presentation about the people who worked there and the people who were admitted. At the time there was little understanding of the difference between learning disability and mental illness, thus the change of name in 1884 to the Royal Albert Asylum for the Care, Education and Training of Idiots, Imbeciles, and Weak Minded Children and Young Persons of the Northern Counties. Quite a mouthful – how times have changed, thankfully!

Whitebeck Nature Reserve



(In future Eddie Hodgson will be posting updates on the villages' WhatsApp to let you know how the wildflower meadow is coming along.)

If you pay the reserve a visit you will see that the wild grasses are still dominating. However, it looks like all of the plugs Eddie planted in the autumn have rooted and the great news is that the yellow rattle seed has germinated. Known as 'the meadow maker' or 'nature's lawnmower', yellow rattle is the single most important plant you need to establish when creating a wildflower meadow. Yellow rattle (Rhinanthus minor) is an annual, completing its life cycle in one year. In early spring the seeds germinate and grow quickly. As their roots develop underground they seek out the roots of plants growing nearby, especially grasses. Once contact is made the yellow rattle draws water and nutrients from them, suppressing the growth of grasses by as much as 60%. In the resulting space, other flowers have room to grow.





The hedge trimmings from our hedge laying work have now dried and we can gather them up for burning. Andrew Robinson has agreed to lend us a few sheep to "eat-off" the unfenced section of the site. We should be tidy by the end of lune.
