Monthly Bible Study Group

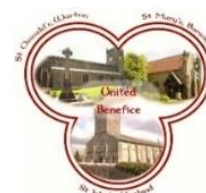
The monthly bible study group normally meets on the second Monday of each month from 10am-12noon at Fernlands, Tewitfield.

The talk will include the impact of enlistment on a village population, by comparing statistics of one local village to national available data.
